

BIKE REGISTER FAQS

How does registration work?

When you bring your bike to an event there are a few simple steps to get your bike registered. We locate the serial number of your bike (usually on the underside of the frame) and install 2 antitamper stickers with a unique Bike Register ID on them. We'll record the unique ID and frame number along with your details in the Bike Register app and then you're all set! You'll then receive an email to confirm your bike has been registered and to activate your online account.

Do I need to pay to register my bike?

No, the registration of bikes at events is free. Your profile on the Bike Register Database is also free.

Can I have more than 1 bike on my account?

Yes! When a new bike is registered, your details will be matched and the bike will be added using your existing details. If you add a bike yourself, you can do this through the 'Register another bike' button after logging in to your existing online account.

What happens if I sell my bike?

You can easily transfer the ownership of your bike on your online account. All you need is the new owner's email address. Login to your account, select the bike and click the 'Transfer' Tab. Here you can enter the email address of the new owner. They will receive an email with details on how to set up and account if they do not already have one and complete the transfer.

What do I need to do if my bike is stolen?

You will need to update the status of your bike on your online account. To do so, login to your account and select the bike you wish to change the status of. Select the 'Report as stolen' button and enter as much information as you can about the theft including the Crime Reference Number.

How does being on the Bike Register help my bike being returned to me?

All the police forces in the UK have the ability to search the Bike Register Database using a specially developed App. They may check bikes in bike stands outside buildings or at stations as part of their normal duties. If bikes are registered as stolen, they can get in touch with the registered owner and get the bike returned to you. Alternatively, they can check the registered owner's details with the details of the person in possession of the bike to ensure they match.

My bike has 2 stickers on it, are they not for 2 bikes?

No. We fit a pair of stickers on bikes as they both have the same unique Bike Register ID and QR code. One is usually installed near your bikes frame number and the other in an overt location on the bike to inform would-be thieves that the bike is on the Bike Register. The stickers are also highly tamperproof so installing 2 labels makes it twice as difficult to remove the unique code linked to your bike.

Can I register my bike in other ways?

You can register any bike using just the frame number on the bikeregister.com website. Adding as much unique information about your bike, such as a Bike Register ID or photos, helps to support your profile. As well as the QR labels, we can apply unique codes using a black or UV permanent marking compound. These can be applied to any bike that has a painted or lacquered finish.

BIKE REGISTRATION

Dear Parent / Carer,

To mark the completion of new cycling, pedestrian and equestrian infrastructure along the East Leeds Orbital Route (ELOR) Leeds City Council will be running a 'Bike Register' bike security marking event at school.

If you would like a bike to be marked, West Yorkshire Police and the Influencing Travel Behaviour Team from LCC will be at school on Thursday 30th March and will register bikes that are brought in and left at school in the morning.

If you would like your child's bike to be registered, please complete the information in the table below, place it into an envelope (or fold it so the details are hidden) and attach it to the bike handlebars. Bring the bike to the front of school office. The team will then work through the bikes through the day and they will be ready to collect at the end of the school day. Any paperwork containing personal details will be destroyed once the bike is registered.

Once the bike is registered, you will receive an email link which gives more information about Bike Register and asks you to finish setting up the account. If you haven't received anything by the end of the day, check in your junk / spam folders. If there is nothing in those folders, please email bikeregister@leeds.gov.uk and they will look into it for you.

This service is aimed at school pupils. However, if parents/family wish to get their bikes marked up then please speak with a member of staff/officer conducting the marking and they may be able to assist you there and then.

The marking involves two tamper-proof stickers with unique QR codes being fixed to the bike's frame – one in a visible position and one hidden from view. The code is linked to contact information for the bike's owner (or parent / carer in the case of a child's bike), so that the bike can be returned to the owner if it is stolen and then found by the police.

The stickers also help reduce the risk of the bike being stolen by warning thieves that it is linked to the Bike Register system.

The data is stored on a secure portal which can only be accessed by the police and 'Selectamark' who run the system. Bike Register is accredited to ISO 27001, Secured by Design and LPS 1224 standards.

We hope to see lots of you taking up this great opportunity to get your bikes marked up!

Once registered by us, you will receive an email from Bike Register asking you to complete your registration. If you are registering multiple bikes (e.g. adult / child or siblings), you should receive an email confirmation for each bike. You can then add additional information, such as a photograph of the bike, to the record for each bike.

This sheet will be destroyed once registered and no information will be taken off site.
